Tue 06 DEPART SAN FRANCISCO

The 12.5 hour non stop flight departs in the evening. Dinner and breakfast will be served on board and each seat has an entertainment screen with movies, TV, audio books and music.

Wed 07 CROSS THE INTERNATIONAL DATELINE

During the night you will cross the International Dateline making your arrival in New Zealand a day later. This day is gained on the return.

Thu 08 ARRIVE AUCKLAND / CHRISTCHURCH

Arrive Auckland about 5:00am local time and transfer to a domestic flight to Christchurch.

On arrival about 8:30am in Christchurch proceed through Customs and meet your South island driver who will transfer you to your accommodation.

Though much of the central business district of Christchurch was ruined in the February 2011 earthquake other areas were unaffected and it remains one of the loveliest cities. It is also considered to be the most English city outside of England.

After settling in to your accommodation, enjoy a walk alongside the meandering Avon River through the extensive **Botanical Gardens** approximately a mile from your hotel. Remainder of the day free.

(D) In the early evening gather for a welcome **dinner** at your hotel (TO BE CONFIRMED).

CHRISTCHURCH / PUNAKAIKI or GREYMOUTH

(B)

Breakfast at your hotel.

First visit the **Antarctic Centre** where you will experience conditions as they are on the great southern continent. The penguins are a special feature here. Then drive across the alluvial Canterbury Plains towards the magnificent Southern Alps. Stop en-route for a short walk through Castle Rock, an amazing outcrop of rocks on the foothills of the Alps and at Arthur's Pass take a walk through the alpine meadow or, if you are feeling really energetic, a quick hike up one of the nearby mountain tracks. Cross Arthurs Pass and descend through stunning vistas following the Taramakau River to the coast then travel north through Greymouth. Total driving time about 3 hours.



If waitlist at Punakaiki does not clear, spend overnight in Greymouth.

If waitlist for Punakaiki Resort has cleared, continue north to Punakaiki, known for its rugged coastline and the famous Pancake Rocks and blowholes. These stratified limestone stacks are an extraordinary monument of nature.

AT PUNAKAIKI

(B)

Breakfast at your hotel.

This morning, walk along the Pororari River Track into Paparoa National Park. The track follows the Pororari River upstream into the Paparoa National Park. The lower section of the track passes through the Pororari River Gorge – a valley lined on both sides by dramatic limestone cliffs and bluffs towering over the gorge and river. The track passes through a dense sub-tropical forest of coastal broadleaf plants, nikau palms, tree ferns and towering rata. Fifteen-minutes walk from the bridge is a picnic spot and popular swimming hole during the warmer summer months. Bird life on the Pororari River Track includes native Weka, a large, brown flightless bird that has a famously feisty and curious personality.

Also Tomtits, New Zealand Bush Robins, native Pigeons, Tuis and Bellbirds. At the end of the gorge, the middle section of the track emerges onto the open Pororari River flats where it intersects with the Inland Pack Track. The Pororari River Track continues across the flatter terrain, following the river until the upper section enters another valley.



Time also today to explore the Pancake Rocks and view the Blowhole.

Sun 11 PUNAKAIKI or GREYMOUTH / FOX GLACIER

(B)

Breakfast at your hotel.

From Greymouth drive south along the West Coast to Hokitika for a coffee stop and a browse through local craft stores and one of the greenstone factories where a local jade-like stone highly prized by Maori is crafted into exquisite jewellery. A little further south stop for a walk on the **Mahinapua Walkway**. This 3-hour walk starts along an old milling rail line and includes a deer farm, boardwalks across ponds, then exotic and native forest with a detour to view the lake. Following the walk continue the drive south through forests and farmland with views of the Alps to your east and the Tasman Sea to the west, to the village of **Franz Josef**.

The huge rivers of snow and ice of the Franz Josef and Fox Glaciers flow from snowfields high in the Southern Alps almost to sea level which is unusual in a temperate climate. Take a short walk up to view the glacier and, time permitting, a longer walk to the face before continuing to the township of Fox for overnight (alternatively, visit the Fox Glacier where viewing may be better). Total driving time about 3 hours.

Mon 12**FOX GLACIER / WANAKA**

(B)

Breakfast at your hotel.

Time and weather conditions permitting, visit **Lake Matheson** early this morning for a short walk to the lake or a longer walk around the lake. On a clear day this walk offers unsurpassed reflective views of Aoraki (Mt Cook), Mt Tasman and the forested lakeshore.



From Fox travel south along the coast enjoying spectacular views of the Tasman Sea before turning inland and following the mighty Haast River towards Haast Pass. Once over the pass the scenery changes abruptly as you enter the Central Otago region. There are many short rainforest walks en-route to waterfalls and streams. Total driving time about 3hours.

Continue by coach past Lakes Hawea and Wanaka to the lakeside village of Wanaka.

Tue 13**AT WANAKA**

(B)

Breakfast at your hotel.

Today if it can be arranged join a local hiking club for the walk of their choice or hike on a local walkway such as the Clutha River Track or one of the hikes in Mt Aspiring National Park.

At Lake Wanaka's south-eastern tip, water pours out of the lake and into the Clutha, the South Island's largest river. You can walk or bike to the start of the Clutha from Wanaka township - the track begins to the right of the playground on the lakefront. Once past Beacon Point, the recreation ground known as 'The Outlet' opens up before you. This area is popular with fishermen, families, joggers and cyclists. The track continues along the riverbank all the way to Albert Town. It is particularly scenic, with constant views of the Clutha's

emerald-green water, the odd trout lurking in the shadows and the tangy aroma of the Manuka trees.

Time also today to explore the lakeside village of Wanaka and its many cafes and boutique shops. Or visit the War Birds Museum or check out the Maze.

Wed 14 **WANAKA / TE ANAU**

(B) Breakfast at your hotel.

A more relaxing day today as you depart early in the morning and drive across the Central Otago countryside through Cromwell and the Kawarau Gorge. Bypass Queenstown and travel around Lake Wakatipu to the village of Te Anau, gateway to Fiordland National Park and starting point for some of New Zealand's most famous walking tracks. On arrival a short walk around the lake to the Department of Conservation aviaries is recommended. Total driving time about 3 hours.

7.00 pm Depart on a cruise across Lake Te Anau to the **Te Anau-au Caves**. Experienced guides take visitors into the caves by path and small boats underground. Highlights include incredible limestone caverns, whirlpools, waterfalls and the glowworm grotto. On conclusion of tour, return to Te Anau by launch. Walk to and from Te Anau Wharf.

9.15 pm Arrive back at Te Anau Wharf.

Thu 15 **AT TE ANAU**

(B) Breakfast at your hotel.

This morning enjoy a hike on the **Lower Kepler Track**. This is a section of one of New Zealand's Great Walks and it is stunning. After crossing a swing bridge over the raging Waiau River walk for 3-hours through a forest of southern beech festooned with ferns and moss. The tiny beech leaves on the track will add a spring to your steps!

Afternoon free to explore the village or spend some time in the Department of Conservation headquarters to learn more about Fiordland ecology and wildlife.

Sat 16 **TE ANAU / MILFORD SOUND**

(BD) Breakfast at your hotel.

This morning drive into **Fiordland National Park**. The scenery is stunning with towering mountains, glacially carved valleys, streams, waterfalls and rainforest. There are many short walks but, a 2-3 hour walk on the famous **Routeburn Track to Key Summit** is recommended. Total driving time about 2 hours.

4.30 pm

On arrival at Milford board the **MV Milford Wanderer** for a cruise down the sound to the Tasman Sea. Cruise close to towering rock faces and waterfalls. Return and anchor overnight in a protected bay. There are options to kayak on your own or take a ride on the ship's tender with a nature guide.
A three-course **dinner** is served on board.



Accommodation is in comfortable, private twin/double share cabins with shared bathroom facilities. Bed linen, duvet/quilt, pillow and towels are provided.

Sun 17 **MILFORD SOUND / QUEENSTOWN**

(B) Breakfast served on board.

9.30 am

The Wanderer returns to Milford Wharf. Board your coach and return through the Hollyford and Eglinton Valleys with time for the shorter Fiordland walks en-route.

Continue through Te Anau and on to Queenstown. Total driving time about 4.5 hours. A brisk climb up **Queenstown Hill** is recommended for those with energy to spare.

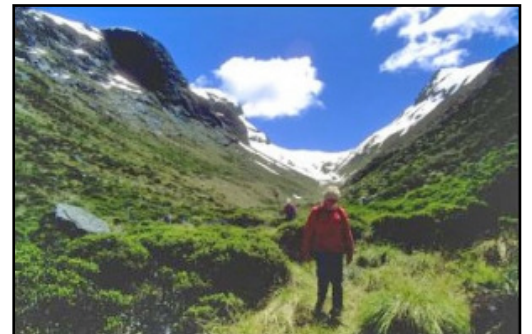

Mon 18 **AT QUEENSTOWN**

(B) Breakfast at your hotel.

Today travel by coach around Lake Wakatipu to the small settlement of Glenorchy. From here take a walk on the famous Routeburn Track. This 3-day track, listed among the Great Hikes of New Zealand passes over the mountains between Lake Wakatipu and the road to Milford. The lower part of the track is a broad and level walk through forest and meadows.



Optional: *Funyak jet boat and Kayaking excursion. See Note 3*

Tue 19 **QUEENSTOWN / ROTORUA**

(B) Breakfast at your hotel.
Transfer to Queenstown Airport and check in for flight to Rotorua.

Meet on arrival and visit **Rainbow Springs** to see some of New Zealand’s native birds and the enormous rainbow trout that were introduced to New Zealand from the Russian River area of California. Also see the entertaining and informative Sheep Show at the **Agrodome** where you will learn about New Zealand’s agricultural background, the different breeds of sheep, watch sheep shearing and sheepdogs working. .

Stop at **St. Faiths Anglican Church** at Ohinemutu, where you will see the blending of English and Maori architecture and art (self-guided tour – no entrance possible to Ohinemutu if a *tangi* (funeral) in progress).

Time also today to explore this popular town and do some shopping.

Rotorua is located in the heart of New Zealand’s famous thermal region and forms part of the geologically active “Pacific Rim of Fire”. Situated on the shores of Lake Rotorua, it is also renowned for Maori cultural activities

Wed 20 **AT ROTORUA**

(B,D) Breakfast at your hotel.
The annual Rotorua Walking Festival takes place this week and we hope to be able to participate in one of their organized walks. Alternatively, take a walk on the tranquil Lake Okataina Walkway.

4.30 pm Late this afternoon enjoy a tour of the Whakarewarewa Thermal Reserve and the Maori Cultural Centre at **Te Puia**, and then enjoy a **Maori hangi feast and concert**.



Thu 21 **ROTORUA / PUTARURU / AUCKLAND**

(B) Breakfast at your hotel.
Today travel north to Auckland stopping en-route at the Te Waihou walkway near Putaruru where you will be joined by members of the Putaruru Walking Club for a 1½-hour walk.

The Te Waihou Walkway ranges from easy walking to steeper places with steps and stiles and boardwalks across wetland areas. A loop track provides views over stunning areas and access to the northern bank via two foot bridges. The walkway passes through areas of reforestation and regeneration of wetland and native plantings and crosses rolling pastoral land beside the river. Small waterfalls in the native bush add to the beauty of the area and trout are plentiful. The water is extremely clear and has a remarkable blue hue. Following the walk continue your drive through the Waikato farmlands into Auckland arriving late afternoon. Total driving time about 3 hours.

Time to explore downtown and the cafes and winebars of the Viaduct Harbour this evening.

Thu 22 **WAIHEKE ISLAND EXCURSION**

(B)

Breakfast at your hotel.

This morning walk the short distance to the Ferry Building on the waterfront. Depart Auckland for a 35-minute cruise across the picturesque Hauraki Gulf to Waiheke Island. This island is known for its beautiful beaches, boutique wineries and artisans. From the ferry wharf follow the undulating track around the coast with stunning views back to Auckland city. Then climb through paddocks, and through native bush before arriving in the village of Oneroa where there is time for a stroll, and coffee before continuing back to the wharf for the return ferry. The total walk is about 3 hours.



Remainder of the day and evening at leisure.

Fri 23 **WAITAKERES AND WEST AUCKLAND**

(B,D)

Breakfast at your hotel.

This morning drive out to the **Waitakere Ranges** west of Auckland. This area is crisscrossed with walking tracks which can be combined with wild beach walks. It is where the movie *The Piano* was filmed. Stop to pick up a picnic lunch in the village of Titirangi and visit the Arataki Visitor Centre before embarking on your final New Zealand hike in this stunning area of forest and beach.

After the hike continue to the West Auckland winery region for some **wine tasting** at **two local wineries** before returning to Auckland. .

Enjoy a final **farewell dinner** together this evening.

Sat 24 DEPART AUCKLAND

(B) Breakfast at your hotel.
Day at leisure to rest, finish shopping, or further exploration before transferring to Auckland International Airport (normal room check out time applies: 11:00am – luggage may be stored at the hotel until departure).
Check in for your flight to San Francisco.
Depart Auckland or, extend your tour with a trip to the Bay of Islands.

4. **Siberia Experience:** The Siberia Experience leaves from Makarora at the head of Lake Wanaka and allows you to enjoy some of New Zealand's untouched scenery from the air, on land and from the water. Mountains, rivers, glaciers, alpine lakes, rain forest, waterfalls and more. First take a 25 minute flight with stunning views, capturing the rugged beauty of New Zealand's World Heritage National Park. See glaciers, ice, snow, mountain lakes, hanging valleys, vast rain forests, dramatic unspoiled beauty. Land in the Siberia Valley to begin a 2.5hr walk through native beech forest on a well marked track linking the remote Siberia Valley with the wilderness of the Wilkin Valley before you rendezvous with the Wilkin River Jets for a thrilling and uniquely scenic 30 minute trip to Makarora.

\$245.00 per person ex Glenorchy. Includes picnic lunch. **Fun Yaks:** Report to Glenorchy at 8.45am. Enjoy a **75-minute jetboat ride** up the braided channels of the Dart River into the Mt Aspiring National Park learning about the flora, fauna and history of the area. On leaving the jetboat there will be a full safety briefing and training session by your guide before paddling downstream to Paradise by **Funyak inflatable canoe** (2 hours) surrounded by the snow-capped mountains and native bush with a picnic lunch at a scenic stop en route. There are places that you will be able to explore, which are only reachable by canoe such as the Rockburn Chasm and there is also a **40-minute backroad journey** to Glenorchy which passes through locations used in the 'Lord of the Rings' movie trilogy. You will reach Glenorchy approx 3.30pm and Queenstown approx 4.30pm – 5.00pm.

ABEL TASMAN NATIONAL PARK**

ARRIVE WELLINGTON. Transfer by shuttle to your downtown accommodation. Wellington, the capital of New Zealand is a vibrant city somewhat evocative of San Francisco with narrow streets and hills and plenty of interesting cafes and winebars. Recommended activities here include: A visit to Te Papa, NZ's national museum, a cable car ride to the Botanical Gardens and a stroll downhill to downtown, a visit to Zealandia, an "ecological island" where a predator proof fence protects native birds and the unique tuatara.

WELLINGTON TO NELSON Cross Cook Strait by ferry, 3 hours, and either pick up a rental car and self drive or, travel by public coach to Nelson. Nelson is noted for arts and crafts and good weather!

ABEL TASMAN NATIONAL PARK Today either self drive to Kaiterteri and hike on your own in the park or, take a walking/kayaking full day tour with a guide. Either way you will be impressed with the clarity of the water and the stunning sea vistas as you hike and/or kayak.

NELSON TO CHRISTCHURCH Either self drive to Christchurch or travel by public coach to Picton and then take the Coastal Express down the Pacific Coast to Christchurch.

AUCKLAND TO PAIHIA Either self drive from Auckland through the unique Kauri Forest to Hokianga Harbour on the West Coast and then cross to Paihia (full day tour) or, travel by tour bus up the East Coast through Whangarei to Paihia (4 hours)

AT PAIHIA The Bay of Islands is a stunning region consisting of 144 islands, abundant in natural wonder and marine life and the whole Northland area is rich in both culture and early Maori and European history – from Kupe, believed to be the very first Maori voyager to arrive in New Zealand over 1,000 years ago, to the signing of the Treaty of Waitangi between Maori and the Crown. This morning take a cruise through the islands to the famous Hole in the Rock. In the afternoon tour the historical sites of Waitangi and Kerikeri.

AT PAIHIA Consider a day tour to Ninety Mile Beach and Cape Reinga the northernmost tip of New Zealand.

TO AUCKLAND Return to Auckland down the East Coast. If self driving depart this evening. If traveling by tour coach there is not enough time for your connection so stay overnight in Auckland.
